Purpose

This policy aims to provide guidelines for the safe operation of rental fleet golf cars on the premises of Clare Golf and Country Club.

Scope

This policy applies to all members and guests operating rental fleet golf cars on the premises of Clare Golf and Country Club.

Policy Statement

Operation of a rental fleet golf car is limited to persons 16 years or older. Persons 16 to 18 years inclusive must hold a valid drivers' licence. * Persons 19 years or older may operate a golf car whether or not they hold a valid drivers' licence. Operators of a golf car assume full responsibility and liability for any damage to property or personal injury, and will not hold Clare Golf and Country Club responsible for personal injury and/or property damage incurred as a result of operating a rental fleet golf car.

* The appropriate *Parental Permission* form must be signed before persons aged 16 to 18 years will be permitted to rent a golf car.

Roles and Responsibilities

1. The Pro shop staff and management are responsible for the enforcement of the rules of operation of rental fleet golf cars.
2. Clare Golf and Country Club will ensure that the rental fleet is regularly maintained and meets normal safety standards.
3. Operators must ensure that toddlers or young children are not left unattended in a golf car.
4. Operators must not drive golf cars while impaired.
5. A maximum of 2 adults or juniors or 1 adult and 2 small youth are permitted per car.
6. A sign at #1 tee informs players as to where cars may be driven on any given day. This instruction must be observed on the whole of the course.
7. Golf cars must not be driven on tees, in bunkers, nor within 30 feet of greens. Soft ground must be avoided whenever possible.
8. Golf cars must be driven in a responsible and respectful manner, in keeping with the rules of safety and the etiquette of golf.
